IN-COUNTY / OUT-OF-COUNTY TRANSFER GUIDELINES

Eligibility

- 1. Parents and students should realize that a transfer/tuition is a privilege granted by the Hancock County Board of Education and is for the purpose of enhancing the educational opportunity of each student who is approved.
- 2. Student consideration is on a first-come, first-serve basis. Applications will be accepted the first Monday after Spring Break.
- 3. Approval is on a student-by-student basis with no consideration of siblings.
- 4. Each application will be date and time stamped when received in the Hancock County Central Office.
- 5. Applications will be considered in order of date/time of application, with children of employees given first consideration.
- 6. Students with an identified disability as per Kentucky Department of Education regulations, and who need special programming considerations, must be approved by the Director of Special Education.
- 7. Applications will not be processed until class size can be reasonably determined.
- 8. Students shall have demonstrated good behavior, good attendance, and an effort to learn before requesting a transfer.
- 9. Non-resident parents are responsible for transportation. If possible, we will transport from the nearest Hancock County bus stop on our transportation route.
- 10. Non-resident students need not re-apply between elementary, middle, and high school as long as they are in good standing with regard to discipline, attendance, transportation, and account balances.
- 11. Expelled non-resident students will not be accepted by Hancock County Public Schools.

Class Space Priorities

- 1. Students who reside in the established area zoned for that school (resident students).
- 2. Students who reside in the Hancock County School District but outside the area zoned for that school (transfer students).
- 3. Students who reside outside the Hancock County District, in the state of Kentucky, and in another school district with whom we have an agreement to transfer ADA monies (out-of-district students).

Review of Transfer

Transfer status may be revoked at the end of the semester if: a) discipline, b) attendance, c) transportation d) account balances become a significant problem. **Status may be revoked immediately for a severe disciplinary violation.** Parents shall be given prior written notification that non-residency status will be revoked.

Students in Grades: (K-3) 20 ÷ 1 Ratio and coordination with district staffing formula.

(4-5) 24 ÷ 1 Ratio and coordination with district staffing formula.

- 1. Schools closed (by grade level) to in-county transfer students are also closed to out-of-county students.
- 2. Applications will not be processed until class size can reasonably be determined.
- 3. Granting a transfer will not jeopardize the status of a classroom unit at the releasing school.
